A Letter to Our Families—Linda Boxum

Dear SPCS Families,

During December, Father Joe, Mrs. Scupham, Mrs. Kepa, Steve Poole, Jessica Clements and I met to review our school's finances. In those meetings, we judiciously reviewed our current budget, and formulated a new one for the 2015-2016 school year. These meetings are never easy, and require a lot of preparation and prayer to guide us.

For the next school year, a drop in enrollment is anticipated due to a large graduating 8th grade class coupled with one incoming kindergarten class. Our school, along with today's society, is faced with economic challenges including rising heating and cooling costs, a water bill that increased 54% and a 15% increase for trash collection. Additionally, we also are faced with the challenge of declining church donations which further impacts our budget. There is also a diocesan salary raise for both faculty and staff incorporated into our upcoming budget.

After prayerful consideration, it has been decided that the deficit will be covered by three equal contributions from our school savings, the endowment, and a 5% school tuition increase. All other fees, scrip dollars, and hour commitments will remain the same.

Our school's largest sources of income are tuition and fundraising. We are aware that the recruitment of new students and families is an integral part in the continued health and success of our school. As a promotional tool for currently enrolled Tiny Tim's pre-school students, we will offer a \$500.00 Kindergarten tuition credit. We are very blessed to have a healthy savings from which to pull these funds. It is equally important that we support our fundraising efforts wholeheartedly. Ways this can be accomplished are by volunteering to work/chair events, by regularly purchasing scrip and attending fundraising events, and encouraging family and friends to do the same. I encourage you to maximize your scrip contributions. If we all maximize the use of scrip, and even broaden it to non-school families, we can easily offset some of the financial burdens to our budget. As the number of school families decrease, so do our scrip profits. That is why it is even more important for us to attempt to increase our scrip contributions.

It is only with the support and prayers from our SPCS families that our children will be able to thrive both academically and spiritually in our community. I am thankful and humbled by the hard work and dedication of our school staff and our school families which has resulted in a magnificent *faith based education* for our children.

Report Cards

Report cards are coming home today. Please be sure that your tuition account is up to date to ensure receipt of your child's report card.

Dismissal Carline Refresher Quiz:

- What time is appropriate for the line to begin forming?
- What entrance should be used at dismissal?
- How far up should the first car in each line pull up?
- How many cars in line 1? Lines 2-10?

Now that the bridge on Harrison is open please avoid entering or exiting the school parking lot at the stop sign. It is much safer to use the wide center church entrance.

Please, please, please do not arrive any earlier than 2:15. There is NO REASON ANYONE should sit outside a school playground for over an hour. When there are piles of snow, the passages are narrower and the parking lot is not just for the school. The Clothing Center and the Adult Day Care Center need room to pass. Running engines cause polluted air (and warm cars have been known to provide perfect napping opportunities which in itself is unsafe!). **Loading of the lot is never earlier than 2:25. PLEASE DO NO ARRIVE BEFORE 2:15.**

Lastly – Please stay in the row you are assigned when entering the lot. We need to have the maximum number of cars in each row. Row 1 **is shorter than the rest due to the fact that the sidewalk runs out.** There are 7 cars in the rest of the rows, beginning with row 2. Often drivers think they do not fit in row 2 because it is longer than row 1. Also, the first car in each row really **needs to pull up to the yellow line** to allow space for 7 cars.
